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### Pupil Premium Spending 2016-2017

#### Summary of Spending and Actions:

##### Extra-Curricular Activities:

Providing financial support to parents by contributing towards the cost of educational class trips, school residential trips and private music tuition.

##### Small group support:

Additional adults providing extra academic support in pairs or small groups in class, or outside of class in EAL.

##### Clubs:

Paying for children to attend clubs such as Breakfast Club, After School Club and Sports Clubs to ensure they access the full life of the school.

##### Maths Booster Sessions:

Paying for a qualified teacher to work (1:1) and in small groups in order to raise the attainment and progress of PP children.

##### Support for PP children with

##### SEN:

Children with special educational needs or who require additional support from a qualified SEN teacher.

##### ELSA Support

Paying for an ELSA trained adult to work (1:1) with PP children to support their mental health and social development.

##### Forest School:

Our Forest School area has been renovated and developed this academic year, and a TA has had specialist training to lead forest school activities both during the school day and at our afterschool forest school club.
