<u>Extra-Curricular Activities:</u> Providing financial support to parents by contributing towards the cost of educational class trips, school residential trips and private music tuition.	<u>Small group support:</u> Additional adults providing extra academic support in pairs or small groups in class, or outside of class in EAL.	<u>Clubs:</u> Paying for children to attend clubs such as Breakfast Club, After School Club and Sports Clubs to ensure they access the full life of the school.
<u>Maths Booster Sessions:</u> Paying for a qualified teacher to work (1:1) and in small groups in order to raise the attainment and progress of PP children.	<u>Support for PP children with SEN:</u> Children with special educational needs or who require additional support from a qualified SEN teacher.	<u>ELSA Support</u> Paying for an ELSA trained adult to work (1:1) with PP children to support their mental health and social development.
