### Medicines in School.

Generally children taking medicines should be at home, however occasionally it is appropriate that we are asked to administer medicines. You must complete form 3b if you require us to administer medication to your child. Please ask for this form at the office.

In the case of long-term medication, a signed record of administration is kept with the drugs. Any medicine administered will be recorded with a date and time.



### **Extra Curricular Clubs**

We offer a wide range of activities after school throughout the week. They usually run from 3:30 – 4:30. A newsletter is sent out every term with information about the clubs. Children must apply to attend the clubs and return a signed permission slip. Contact the school office for any additional information.

### **Breakfast and After School Clubs**

### **Breakfast Club**

St George's Breakfast Club runs Monday to Friday from 7:45am until 9am in the Busy Room. A selection of breakfast cereals, toast and fruit are available to eat, and the children play together from a selection of board games and craft activities.

Current charges are £3:50 from 7:45am, £2:50 from 8:00am which includes breakfast or just £1 from 8:30am.



### **After School Club**

The After School Club runs from Monday to Friday from 3.30pm until 5.30pm and is a warm and welcoming club that provides a safe and happy environment for your child. A choice of healthy snacks and drinks are available.

The club offers a variety of activities: construction, toys, games, arts and crafts, singing, sports, gardening and a quiet area for homework.

We help the children to improve the skills they already possess and encourage the children to develop new ones.

The club is convenient for working parents and offers piece of mind if you need to use it in an emergency.

The After School Club is run by Mrs Mitchell who has worked within our school for many years and is friendly, enthusiastic and works to ensure that the children have a fun and happy experience.

Current charges are £2.00 for the first 30 minutes, £3.00 for 1 hour and £5.00 for 2 hours.



### Behaviour

We expect excellent behaviour throughout the school. The children at St George's are kind, polite, hard working and considerate of others. They are honest and enjoy attending school. They have a lot of fun and also recognise the importance of working hard and trying their best in all aspects of the school day. We have a behaviour policy which is available on the school website.

We have a Golden Book Assembly every Friday where hard work, effort and good behaviour are rewarded.

### Swimming

We have a swimming pool and all the children have a 30 minute swimming lesson on a weekly basis from a swimming coach. We ask parents and carers for a contribution of £10 per term (per pupil) to support the running of the pool. We ask that all children are provided with suitable swimming hats that completely cover their hair. All children with long hair must have it tied back in a ponytail or bun so that the hair is completely covered. This will ensure that children have as dry hair as possible and return to classes promptly for the next lesson

### Amenities

The school Amenities Fund is an important source of income for us. It enables us to provide all the extra things that are not covered by our main budget. The fund is also used to contribute towards the cost of visiting authors and theatre workshops.

Each year we ask for a contribution of £30 per family or £10 per term.

The Amenities Fund is invaluable to us and we are always grateful for parents' support.

### School uniform

To endeavour to promote a disciplined and purposeful atmosphere and help the child to take a pride in belonging to St George's, the wearing of the school uniform is encouraged.

### Sporting events and representing the school

### **Collaborative working**

We enjoy strong working relationships with other schools in Taunton and work closely on projects. We see this as an excellent opportunity to strengthen relationships between staff at other schools and also provide CPD for the staff in all schools. At present, the school works with Parkfield, Trull, Bishop Henderson and Bishops Hull.

We also work with all the Catholic schools in Somerset. Head Teachers meet on a half-termly basis to discuss collaborative working, providing CPD and support for all schools.

### Trips

We offer a range of trips throughout the school year. We are very fortunate to be so close to Vivary Park, Taunton Museum, Taunton Library and other facilities. We also go further afield to attractions that are linked to our curriculum.

### **Cooked meals**

We offer hot meals to all children on a daily basis. KS1 children are entitled to a free school meal. These are cooked at Bishop Fox's Secondary School. Meals are ordered online and every child will be given a logon when they start school. Meals must be ordered by Wednesday of the previous week.



### Healthy lunch and snacks

The children who do not have a cooked meal are asked to bring in a healthy packed lunch. KS1 have a healthy snack provided for them. KS2 are encouraged to bring in a snack (fruit snacks only please).

Children are entitled to free milk up until their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday.

### Supporting Reading at home

We ask parents to support with reading at home by listening to the children read on a regular basis. We aim for the children to read at least five times a week. We also encourage parents to read to their children on a regular basis regardless of their age.

### **School Library**

We have a wonderful school library with a wide range of books. Children are given a library membership card and are allowed to borrow one book at a time. Books can be borrowed for two weeks and then children can either renew the loan or change their book. We do ask that the books are looked after and cared for.



### When is a good time to speak to the teacher?

We have an open-door policy at the school and parents are welcome to speak with the class teacher and office staff if they have any enquiries. After school is regarded as the best time to speak with a teacher. Please call the office to make an appointment as teachers often run clubs and have scheduled meetings but if it is an emergency the class teacher will try to make themselves available in the morning before they have begun teaching.

### **Parent volunteers**

We do ask for parent volunteers for a range of activities at the school including school trips, listening to readers, changing books, supporting with sporting events and much more. Please let the class teacher and office know if you are able to support. Volunteers must complete a DBS check when volunteering in school – please ask at the office for further information.

### Celebrations

We have many celebrations throughout the school year. A calendar of dates is issued at the start of the school year and parents are welcome to events such as Mass, Stations of the Cross, Christmas Nativities, Carol Services, Christmas Fayres and Summer Fetes.



### **Child Protection**

Child Protection is taken very seriously at the school. If you have any concerns please see Mr Braund (Designated Lead for Safeguarding) or Mr Lake, Mrs Crocker or Mrs Bullock (Designated Deputy Leads for Safeguarding). We do allow photos to be taken at school events. However, it is school policy that such photos **must not be shared on social media.** 

### Links with the church

We have very strong links with St George's Church. Monsignor Bernard is visible throughout the school and takes an assembly every half-term. The Year 4, 5 and 6 children attend a penitential service three times a year. The whole school celebrates Mass at the start of term in St George's Church and in school at the end of term.

### Attendance

Attendance in school is vital for a child's learning and development. Every day is crucial. We are always aiming for 100% attendance from all pupils.

Holidays during term time cannot be authorised unless it is for exceptional circumstances.

### **Contact details**

We ask all parents to inform the office immediately when there has been a change in contact details. We require three different contact numbers.

### Sickness

On the first day of sickness, parents must call the office to report their child's absence from school. On the child's return, they should return an explanatory note, explaining the absence.

If a child has been sick or had diarrhoea they must not return to school until 48 hours from the last time that they were sick or had diarrhoea.

### **The School Calendar**

A calendar of school events are available on the website. The calendar for the year is produced every summer in readiness for the next academic year.

### School closure

In extreme conditions the school may need to close. Parents are advised to check the school website and twitter account for updates when this may occur.

### Residential

At present we offer three residential trips throughout the school year but this is in the process of being reviewed due to costings.

Class Four spend a night camping at Hestercombe in June, Class Five stay at Kilve Court in February and Class Six go to Pinkery in September.



### **Road Safety and Parking at St George's Catholic School**

We appreciate that the mornings and afternoons can be very busy but also feel we are very fortunate to have the playground that we are able to use as a car park.

We expect all parents and carers to follow the school's directions when dropping off in the morning and collecting at the end of the day.

We expect that all drivers be mindful of speed and be extra vigilant and aware of pedestrians. We have families that walk to school and we want to ensure the safety for all of our children and families.

We expect all parents and carers to be supportive and understanding of the role of our caretaker when reminding us all of our duty of care. Mr Davies and Mr Braund are simply making sure that everyone is safe. There are times when Mr Davies may face the frustrations of parents and carers and we hope that everybody understands the vital role they have. Mr Davies does not need to be outside the school in the mornings and afternoons. He is there to ensure everyone is safe. There are very few occasions when Mr Davies and Mr Braund are not outside and it is particularly those days when drivers take advantage and leave cars with no consideration of others.

It is really important that <u>everyone</u> follows the one-way route which takes you down the side of the school and into the KS1 playground and back up through the staff car park. We have included photos to hopefully clarify understanding.

There are times when parents and carers choose to ignore our one-way route and this causes congestion. It also causes much concern with residents at Nunsfield Court. Nunsfield Court is housing for retired people. There is frustration at times from some residents who have spoken about parents and carers driving onto the premises to turn their cars around. There are signs prohibiting this but these signs are ignored.

We all want the children and families to arrive and leave safely and yet there are some drivers that are choosing to ignore this so that they can save a few minutes.



Please can parents and carers <u>remain</u> in cars facing the one way route. School staff will remain with the children on the playground until you are able to park up on the KS1 playground. Please do not leave cars or wait on single yellow lines or the zig zags. We have a traffic warden who regularly visits the area and he has highlighted this concern.



We have double yellow lines outside the main gates to the school. This must be left clear during drop off and pick-up to prevent congestion.

Here are our 5 Steps to pick up at the end of a day:

- 1) Use the one-way system. Do not turn around in the church or Nunsfield Court.
- 2) Wait in your car until you are safely on the playground. The staff will stay with your child/children.
- 3) Please pick up as quick as possible to allow other parents to park on the playground.
- 4) Drive sensibly and slowly when near and on the school premises.
- 5) Be considerate to all drivers and pedestrians!

We put leaflets on cars that continue to break these rules as our aim will always be to make the school a safe place for all.

We really appreciate your support and understanding with this. It is our aim to ensure that all children and families are safe. There can at times be delays in the car park but the safety of all must always come first.
