SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

Talk about the difficulties experienced by the Holy Family after Jesus was born. Talk about refugees and their plight today. How are we called to act?

SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

Discuss with your child why Jesus is special to them and to Christians in general. Ask them what their favourite bible story about Jesus is, and tell them yours. In what ways can we be more like Jesus?

Talk about how you will get ready for Easter during Lent as a family? Will you give anything up or do something to help others? If you have an older child provide them with an opportunity to take part in The Stations of the Cross. Ask your child what they are learning about in school this Lenten season.

SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES DID YOU KNOW?

Hot Cross Buns are traditional Good Friday fare for the family to make and eat together, with the pastry cross on top of the buns symbolising and reminding Christians of the cross that Jesus died on. Why not make or eat some with your child this Holy Week?
